Book List Activities

1. Diary: Pretend you are the main character and write a journal entry for each chapter.
2. Write a letter to the author, make a copy of it, and mail the original. Bring in the copy of the letter and anything you receive from the author. (You may also do this by email.)
3. Construct a Diorama with a summary. It must represent setting and characters.
4. Book Cover/Jacket: Design a new cover for your book. It must include the title, author, and summary as well as a book critique and author information.
5. Design a puppet representing a character.
6. Rewrite the ending of your book.
7. Write a letter to a character in the story.
8. Make a poster or brochure about the book you read.
9. Write about the main character. Are you like them or not like them?
10. Construct a bobblehead of a character. (Requires a 2L bottle and a 4in Styrofoam ball for the head). Dress your bottle to represent your character.
11. Write a poem using the characters, setting, or plot of your story.
12. Summarize the book as a comic strip.
13. Write a book review of your book.
14. Prepare a commercial about your book. Act out for your class during the first week of school,
15. Design a bookmark with a summary on the back advertising your book.
16. Design a book quilt with 9 squares. In sequence, draw a picture representing the story plot.
17. Explain why you think this book will or will not be read 100 years from now. Support your opinion by stating specific events in the story.
18. Write a ballad, song, or rap about the characters in your book. Set the work to music or song and be prepared to sing it the first week of school.
19. Draw a mural depicting a major scene from the book.
